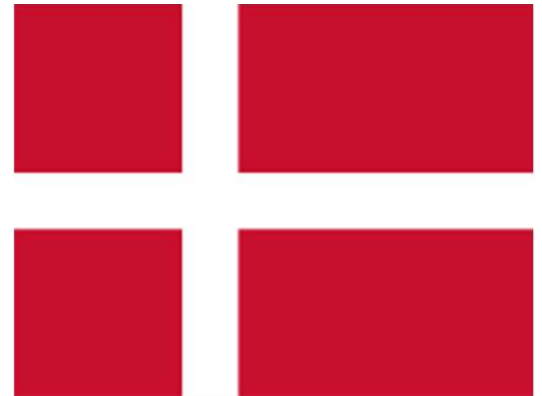

# COPENHAGEN



Copenhagen, the capital of Denmark, is a city rich in history and modern charm. Its origins date back to the 10th century when it was a humble Viking fishing village. By the 12th century, under the influence of Bishop Absalon, Copenhagen began to grow in importance, fortified with a stone wall and becoming a significant trading hub<sup>12</sup>. The city's strategic location and excellent harbor facilitated its development into a major center of commerce.

In the 15th century, Copenhagen was officially designated as the capital of Denmark. The city flourished during the Renaissance, becoming the cultural and economic heart of Scandinavia. However, it faced numerous challenges, including sieges, fires, and battles, such as the British bombardment in 1807. Despite these adversities, Copenhagen continued to expand and modernize, particularly in the 19th and 20th centuries, incorporating surrounding communities and developing new infrastructure.

Today, Copenhagen is renowned for its blend of historic and contemporary architecture. The cityscape is dotted with iconic landmarks such as the Tivoli Gardens, the Little Mermaid statue, and the colorful Nyhavn harbor. The historic center, with its cobblestone streets and medieval buildings, contrasts beautifully with modern developments like the Ørestad district, known for its innovative design and sustainable architecture.

Copenhagen consistently ranks high in global livability indexes, thanks to its excellent quality of life, efficient public transportation, and commitment to sustainability. The city is a pioneer in green initiatives, aiming to become carbon-neutral by 2025. Bicycles are a common sight, with extensive cycling paths making it easy for residents and visitors to navigate the city on two wheels. The culinary scene in Copenhagen is vibrant and diverse, boasting numerous Michelin-starred restaurants, including the world-famous Noma. The city's food markets, like Torvehallerne, offer a taste of local and international delicacies.

Copenhagen is also a hub for arts and culture, with a plethora of museums, galleries, and theaters. The Royal Danish Theatre and the Copenhagen Opera House are just a few venues where you can experience world-class performances.

## 71 Nyhavn Hotel

Take a historical journey along the harbor front, stroll past the majestic Amalienborg Palace, experience Northern Europe's best-preserved fortification Kastellet, and the Little Mermaid. With everything within reach, the hotel is the perfect starting point for exploring Copenhagen; close to culinary temptations, good transport options, and the beautiful view of the Harbor.

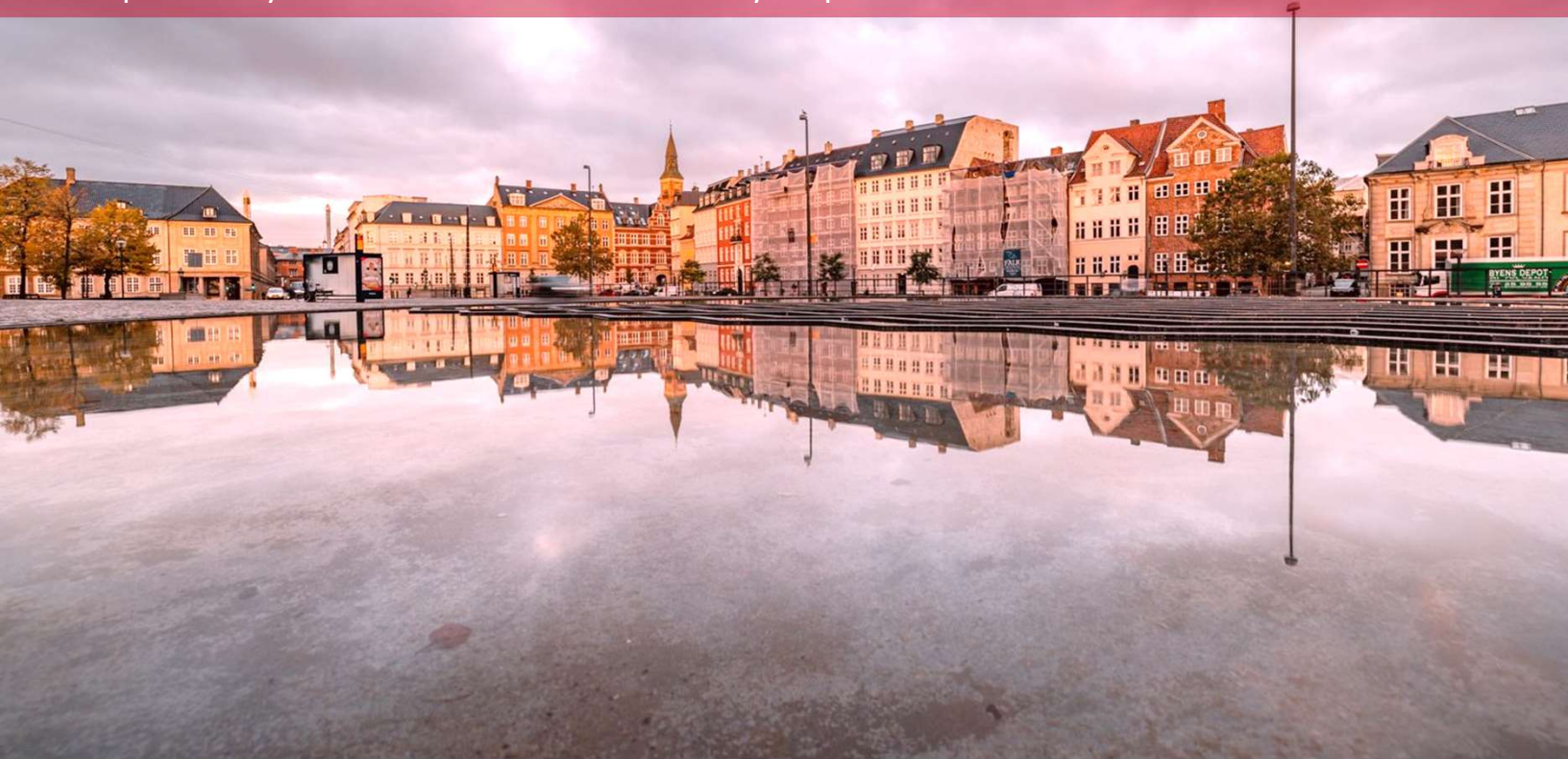

# Copenhagen Activities

## Christiansborg Palace

Located on Slotsholmen in central Copenhagen, this grand palace is the seat of the Danish Parliament, the Prime Minister's Office, and the Supreme Court. It also serves as the Queen's working palace. Marvel at the opulent halls adorned with tapestries, paintings, and chandeliers. Don't miss the Royal Kitchen with its impressive copperware, the beautiful palace chapel with its stunning dome, and the underground ruins that reveal 800 years of history. The Christiansborg Palace Tower, the highest in Copenhagen, offers breathtaking panoramic views of the city.



## Tivoli Gardens

This famous amusement park combines manicured gardens and roller coasters in central Copenhagen, and has been attracting visitors since the 19th century, making it the second-oldest operating amusement park in the world. Visit at night when thousands of twinkling lights make it feel pulled from a fairytale. Be sure to grab lunch or dinner at the restaurant Gemyse, where plant-forward dishes are served inside a greenhouse and a large, lofty dining room.



## The Round Tower (Rundetaarn)

Built in 1642 by King Christian IV, it houses Europe's oldest functioning observatory. Visitors can ascend the unique spiral ramp, which winds 7.5 times around the tower's core, to reach the top. Here, you'll be rewarded with stunning panoramic views of the city. The tower also features the Library Hall, hosting exhibitions and cultural the Observatory, where you can gaze at the stars. The Round Tower offers a fascinating blend of history, science, and breathtaking vistas.



# Copenhagen Activities

## Louisiana Museum of Modern Art

Located north of Copenhagen, Denmark, this outdoor museum is a must-visit for art enthusiasts. This modernist gem seamlessly blends art, architecture, and nature. Visitors can explore a diverse collection of contemporary art. The museum's stunning sculpture park offers breathtaking views of the Øresund Strait. To get there, take the Danish State Railways (DSB) from Copenhagen's Central Station to Humlebæk Station, a 40-minute ride, followed by a 10-15 minute walk to the museum<sup>1</sup>. The Louisiana provides a rich, immersive experience for visitors.



## Canal Tour by boat

A canal tour in Copenhagen offers a unique perspective of the city's stunning architecture and vibrant culture. Departing from Nyhavn, these tours glide through picturesque canals, passing iconic landmarks like the Little Mermaid, Amalienborg Palace, and the Opera House. The one- to three-hour journey provides fascinating insights into Copenhagen's history and modern life. A canal tour is a must-do experience, showcasing the beauty and charm of Denmark's capital from the water.



## Strøget

Strøget, located in the heart of Copenhagen, is one of Europe's longest pedestrian streets, stretching 1.1 kilometers from City Hall Square to Kongens Nytorv. This bustling thoroughfare is a shopper's paradise, featuring a mix of high-end brands as well as budget-friendly stores. Beyond shopping, Strøget offers a vibrant atmosphere with street performers, cafes, and historic landmarks such as the Stork Fountain. It's the perfect place to experience Copenhagen's lively culture and enjoy a leisurely stroll through the city's central district.



# Copenhagen Activities

## Jaegersborggade

This cobbled street fringed with colorful buildings has a slew of great restaurants, bars, and shops. Even though the stretch isn't terribly long, it's the type of place where you easily could spend an entire day. Have a pastry at Meyers Bageri, a coffee at Coffee Collective, lunch at Manfreds, a beer at Mikkeller & Friends, and dinner at Relae. Or, just spend \$5 on a coffee and enjoy the browsing, strolling, and people-watching.



## The Royal Palace Amalienborg

Amalienborg Palace, located in the heart of Copenhagen, is the winter residence of the Danish royal family. This stunning complex consists of four identical classical palace façades surrounding an octagonal courtyard. Visitors can explore the Amalienborg Museum, which offers a glimpse into royal life past and present. Don't miss the daily changing of the Royal Guard at noon, a tradition that draws many spectators. The palace's elegant rooms, adorned with historical artifacts, provide a fascinating insight into Denmark's monarchy.

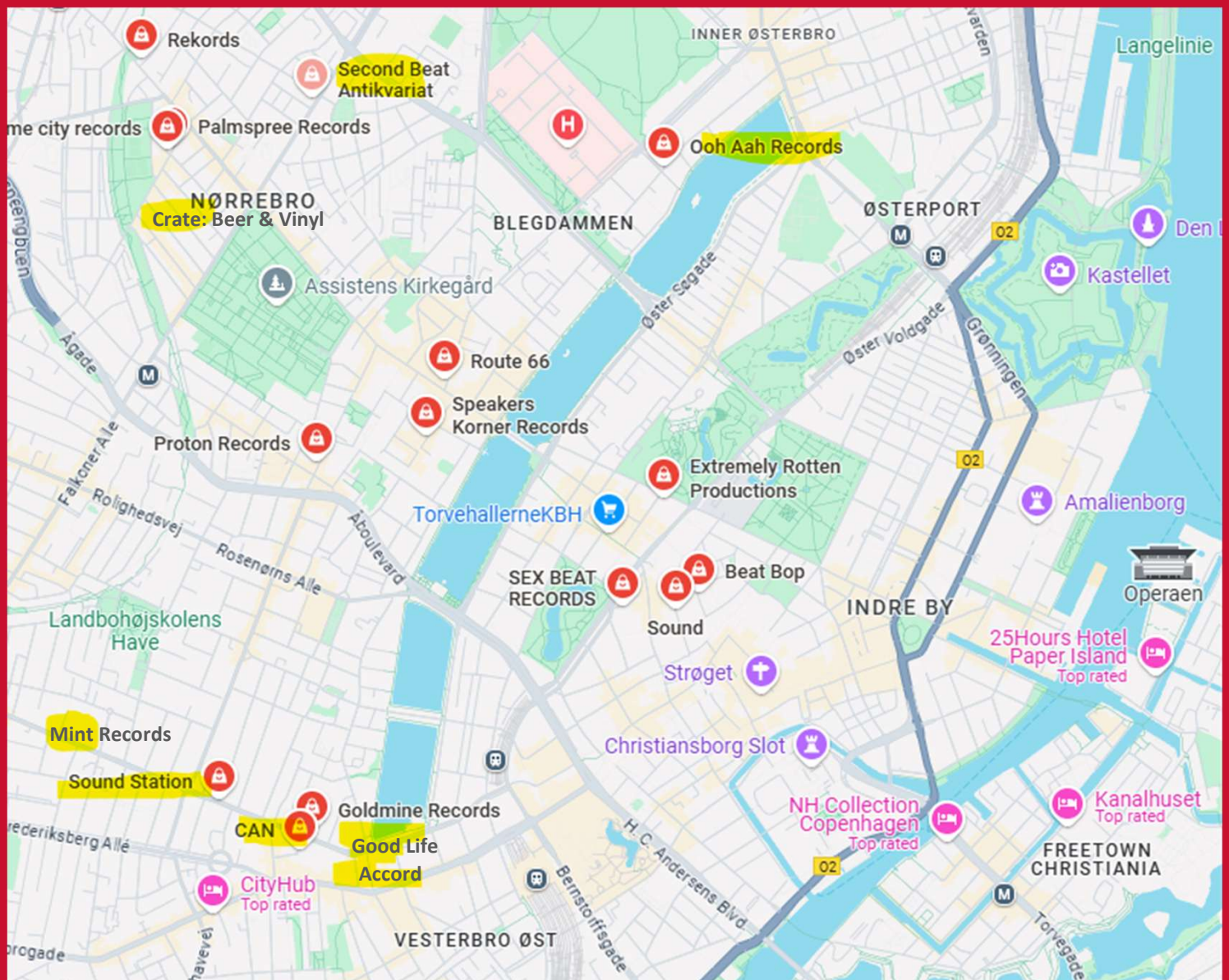


## Rosenborg Castle

This castle dates to 1606 when it was built as a royal summer house by one of the most famous Scandinavian kings, Christian IV. Now it offers a glimpse into Copenhagen's regal history, like a time capsule filled with treasures and works of art. Spend an hour or two here, walking the halls as Danish royalty once did. Don't miss the Knights' Hall with its coronation thrones. You'll also find the king's private writing cabinet, living areas, and bathroom. There's also an impressive Venetian glass collection.



# Record shopping in Copenhagen



## Second Beat

*Jagtvej 129, 2200 Copenhagen N,  
Go for: Danish records, jazz and oddities.*

Nils Rolfgaard's record shop, open for 12 years, offers a dynamic selection of rock, pop, jazz, soul, reggae, and Danish music. With high turnover, Nils ensures regulars always find new records. Though there's no listening booth, he plays records on an audiophile system. The shop also sells curated books, antiques, and collectibles, but vinyl remains the focus.

## Ooh Aah Records

*Ryesgade 77, kl. 2100 Copenhagen  
Go for: Punk rock and experimental.*

Tim Rose's Nørrebro shop specializes in punk rock but also offers progressive rock, experimental, electronic, disco, and soul records. Open for a year, it features 4,000 records and a rack of Pendleton shirts from Tim's US trips. Tim plans to expand and supports local artists. Though there's no listening booth, he plays records through the shop system.

# Record shopping in Copenhagen

## Can Records

*Tullinsgade 5, 1618 Copenhagen V  
Go for: Alternative dance and hard-to-find records.*

Martin Aalykke Kristiansen and his wife run Can Records in Frederiksberg, known for its curated selection tailored to buyers' tastes. Despite its discreet exterior, the shop features a second room with a montage of records. Specializing in early electronic, ambient, new wave, disco, rare groove, and world records, Martin has become a go-to dealer for DJs in Copenhagen.

## Mint Records

*Gammel Kongevej 140A, 1850 Frederiksberg  
Go for: 7" records and bargain bins.*

Mint Records, a true diggers spot, has been in its current location for 6 years. It offers a large stock of vinyl, CDs, and DVDs. Upstairs features soul and jazz, with constantly refreshed new arrivals. Downstairs has bargain bins and in-depth sections for various genres. With 10,000 vinyl records and as many CDs, it operates a stickered pricing system for bargains. Friendly staff and listening booths enhance the experience.

## Sound Station

*Gl. Kongevej 94, 1850 Frederiksberg  
Go for: Classic LPs and new releases.*

Sound Station, soon celebrating its 25th anniversary, is a well-established record shop in Copenhagen. It offers an impressive selection of pop, rock, indie, jazz, and new releases, including independent pop and dance records. Though prices are relatively high, the condition and breadth of stock are excellent. With an estimated 40,000-record catalogue online, it's ideal for finding clean copies of classic records.

## Accord

*Vesterbrogade 63, 1660 Copenhagen V  
Go for: Soundtracks and Danish records.*

Accord, Copenhagen's longest-running record business, began in the 1940s as a second-hand jazz shop. Now with two shops in Copenhagen and one in Kongens Lyngby, the largest in Vesterbro boasts over 50,000 vinyl records. Bargain records are priced at 1 for 30 DKK or 4 for 100 DKK. They offer in-house shrink wrapping and a vast selection of soundtracks and Danish records in the basement.

## GoodLife

*Stefansgade 12, 2200 Copenhagen  
Go for: official re-issues and espresso.*

Kasper's vinyl and coffee shop focuses on curated re-issue LPs, a shift after his original LPs were damaged in the 2011 Copenhagen floods. The shop, an extension of his online business, offers a cozy atmosphere with good coffee (20 DKK for an espresso) and outdoor seating. It features soul, funk, and world music re-issues, including Superfly and Mr. Bongo releases, plus a limited selection of used records.

## Crate: Beer and Vinyl

*Jægersborggade 50, 2200 Copenhagen  
Go for: hip-hop, blues and local beer.*

This craft beer and vinyl shop, opened in April 2015, features an outdoor seating area and bargain bin records for street browsing. It focuses on rock, jazz, blues, soul, and hip-hop, with classic jazz albums and golden age hip-hop records. Local beer is on tap for 40 DKK per 500ml. As evening approaches, it becomes a social hub for regulars discussing records over beer.

This enchanting area is perfect for exploring on foot, providing a rich, immersive experience of Stockholm's heritage and culture. Don't miss the chance to visit the charming shops and galleries, where you can find unique souvenirs and local crafts. Gamla Stan is a must-visit for anyone looking to experience the heart of Stockholm.

# STOCKHOLM



Stockholm, the capital of Sweden, is a city that beautifully blends historical charm with modern innovation. Spread across 14 islands connected by over 50 bridges, it offers a unique and picturesque setting. The city's heart, Gamla Stan (Old Town), is a well-preserved medieval area with narrow cobblestone streets, colorful buildings, and significant landmarks like the Royal Palace and Storkyrkan Cathedral. Here, visitors can explore charming boutiques, cozy cafes, and traditional Swedish restaurants.

Stockholm's history dates back to 1252 when it was first mentioned in letters by Birger Jarl, the Swedish ruler who founded the city. It quickly grew in importance, becoming a royal residence and administrative center. The city's strategic location at the junction of Lake Mälaren and the Baltic Sea made it a vital hub for trade, especially after a trade agreement with the Hanseatic League. This agreement allowed Hansa merchants to trade freely in Sweden, boosting Stockholm's growth.

In the 16th century, Stockholm experienced significant turmoil during the Kalmar Union, a personal union of Sweden, Norway, and Denmark. The conflict culminated in the Stockholm Bloodbath of 1520, when the Danish king Christian II executed many Swedish nobles. However, the city was liberated by Gustav I Vasa in 1523, marking the beginning of Sweden's independence and Stockholm's rapid development.

The 17th century saw Stockholm flourish as Sweden became a great power. The city formally became the capital in 1634, although it had functioned as such since its founding. Today, Stockholm is known for its stunning waterfront views, lush green spaces, and a wealth of cultural institutions.

Visitors can explore world-class museums like the Vasa Museum, which houses a 17th-century warship, and ABBA The Museum, dedicated to the iconic pop group. Nature is never far away, with Djurgården offering attractions like the Skansen open-air museum and the Gröna Lund amusement park. Trendy neighborhoods like Södermalm provide vibrant shopping and dining experiences, while the city's efficient public transport system makes exploring easy.

# Victory Hotel

Lilla Nygatan 5, Stockholm, Sweden

Victory Hotel, located in Stockholm's Old Town, is a charming and exclusive hotel filled with a unique collection of maritime antiques. Named after the British ship HMS Victory, it offers well-appointed rooms, each dedicated to a Swedish sea captain. The hotel combines historical elegance with modern comfort, making it a must-visit. The hotel is centrally located in Stockholm, just a 5-minute walk from Stockholm Palace and 14 minutes by foot from Stockholm City Hall.



# Day 6

The Vasa Museum, located on the island of Djurgården in Stockholm, is one of Scandinavia's most visited museums. It houses the Vasa, a 17th-century warship that sank on her maiden voyage in 1628 and was salvaged in 1961. The ship is remarkably well-preserved, adorned with hundreds of wooden sculptures, offering a unique glimpse into maritime history.

Visitors can explore the main hall, where the Vasa is displayed from six levels, allowing views from the keel to the top of the sterncastle. Surrounding the ship are numerous exhibits and models that detail its construction, sinking, recovery, and conservation. The museum also features artifacts recovered from the ship, providing insights into life aboard a 17th-century warship.

The Vasa Museum's architecture is striking, with a large copper roof and stylized masts representing the ship's original height. The interior combines bare concrete with colorful wooden panels, creating a visually engaging environment. Interactive displays and informative films enhance the visitor experience, making it suitable for all ages.

With over 1.5 million visitors annually, the Vasa Museum is a must-visit destination for history enthusiasts and anyone interested in maritime heritage. It offers a fascinating journey through time, showcasing one of the most significant archaeological discoveries of the 20th century.

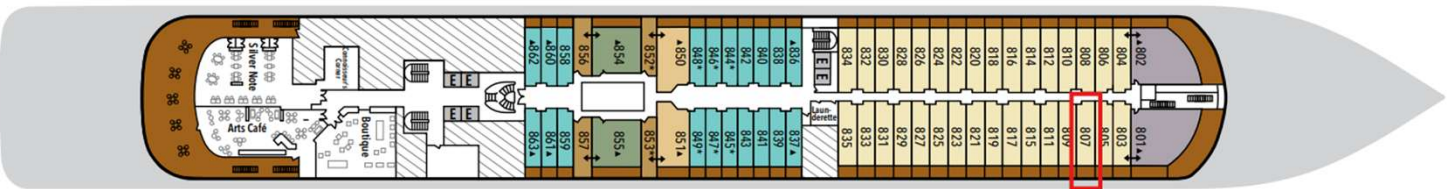
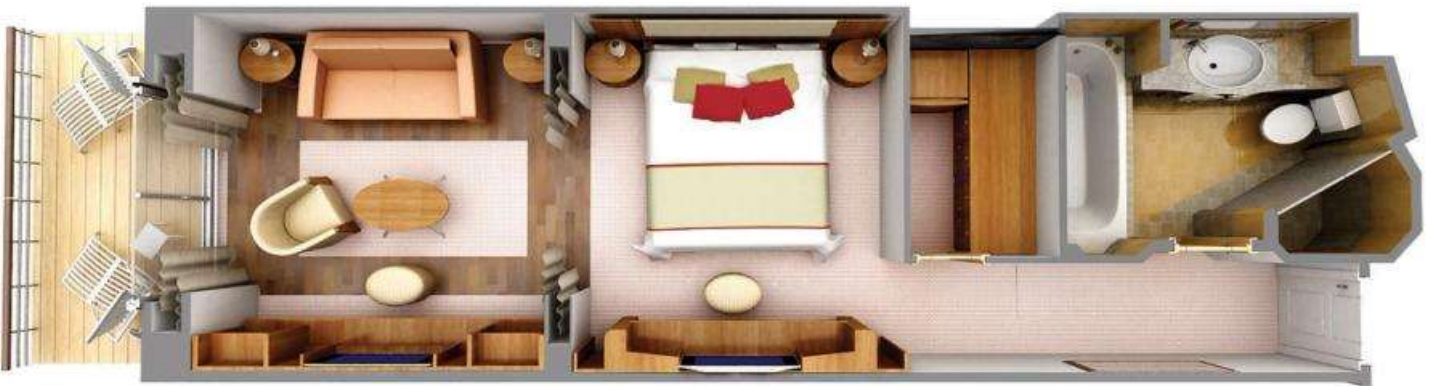

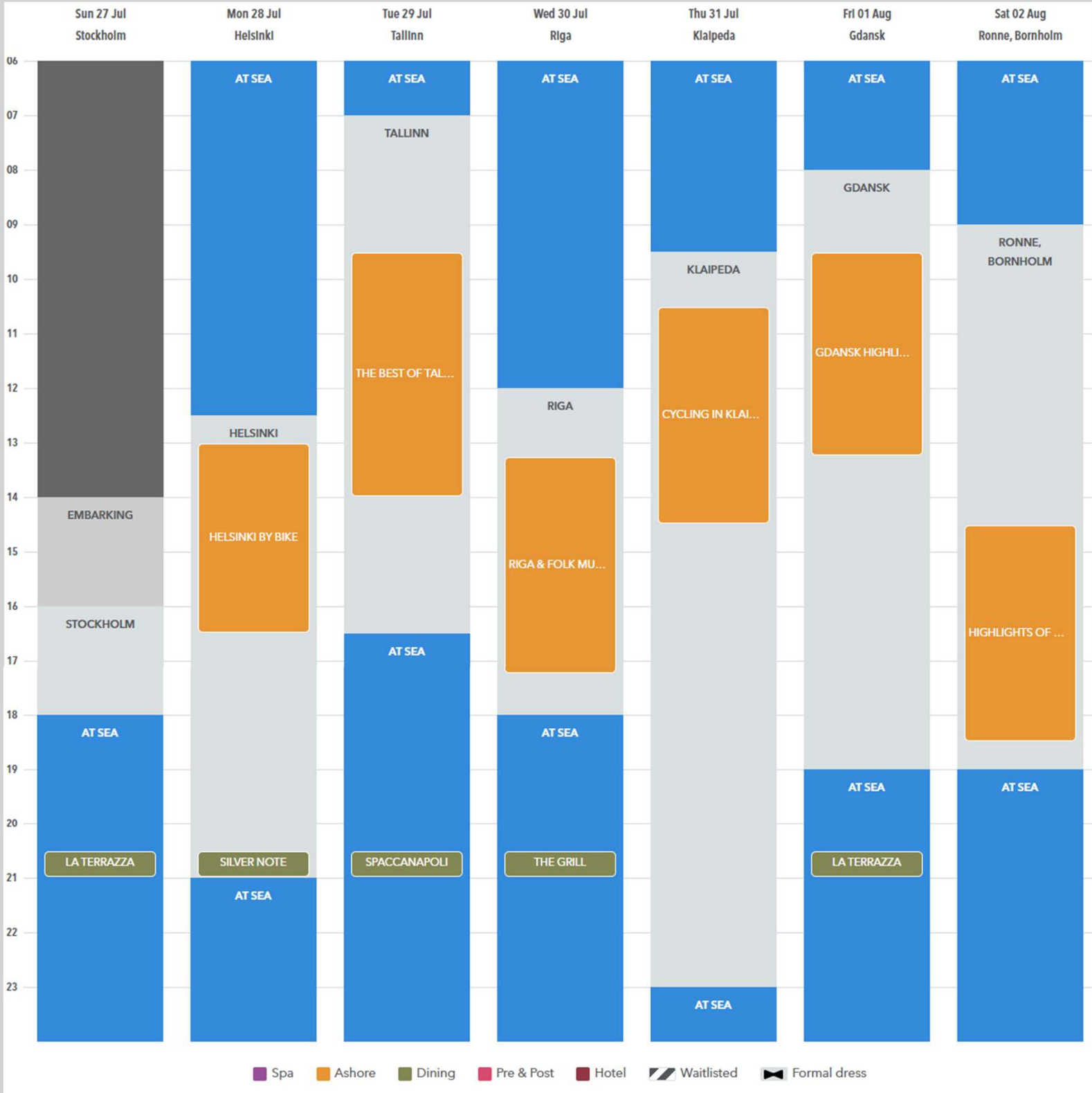

## Excursion: HEL-B / Helsinki by Bike | Duration: 3.50 hrs

Explore the most scenic parts of Helsinki in a unique new way during this tour, invigorating eco-tour via bicycle. Depart the pier with your guide for a scenic, approximate three and a half-hour bicycle tour through the heart of the beautiful city of Helsinki. Along the way, cycle through green areas and parks, pass by museums, admire the sea and feel the spirit of the Downtown area.

Bicycling along mostly flat paths, discover many of Helsinki's highlights and admire the city's waterfront beauty. Rain or shine, your local guide will meet you at the ship with your required helmet, safety vest and a bike.

You will ride through city parks, waterfronts and residential areas till you arrive to Sibelius Park, where you will see the monument to celebrated Finnish composer Jean Sibelius. Pedal to Töölö Bay, where you can enjoy splendid views of the Opera House and the lovely 19th-century villas facing the bay. See the Finlandia Hall, the National Museum and the Parliament building in the distance. Continue along the coastal roads and pass by Kaivopuisto Park and the shipbuilding yard before returning to the pier.

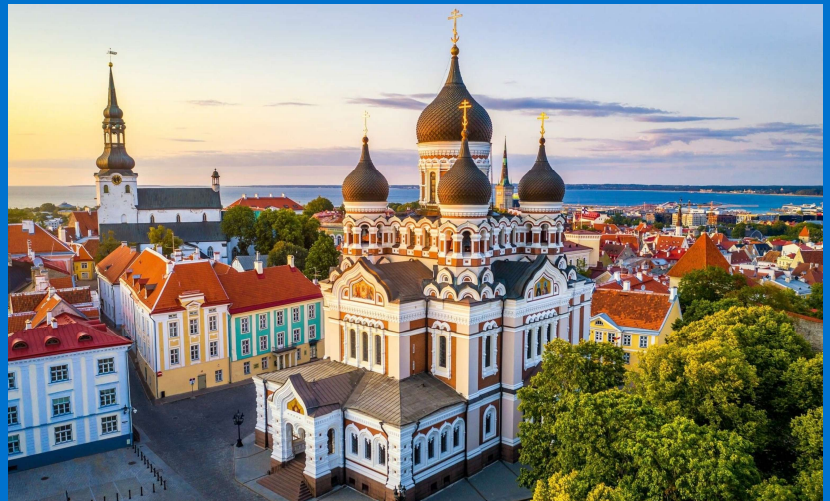

## Excursion: RIX-L/ The Best of Tallinn | Duration: 4.50 hrs

Depart the pier for the short drive to the Upper-Old Town. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour through medieval Tallinn, an UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the best-preserved medieval town centers in Europe. See Toompea Hill, named after a massive, medieval stone castle that today is home to Estonia's parliament. Adjacent to the castle is Pikk Hermann, a medieval tower approximately 150 feet in height with a huge Estonian flag.



Next, your stroll continues on to the Palace Square, site of the Alexeander Nevsky Cathedral. This Russian Orthodox basilica, complete with golden crosses and black onion-shaped domes, was built in the late-19th century during a period of 'Russification'. Step inside the Cathedral to view the icons and mosaics lining its walls. From here, walk to the Dome Church. The oldest church in Tallinn, it is first mentioned in a letter to the Pope dated 1233. Also known as St. Mary's Cathedral, it has served as the burial site for nobility since the 15th century. The Cathedral has a fascinating collection of noble tombstones and stone sarcophagi.

Leaving the Cathedral, walk to a viewing platform for views over the spires of Tallinn's Lower-Old Town. Medieval Tallinn was the northernmost member of the powerful merchant alliance called the Hanseatic League, and the Lower-Old Town is the heart of the old trading city. After a refreshment stop at a local restaurant near Town Hall Square, stroll through the Lower-Old Town and St. Catherine's Passage, a medieval walkway that is home to St. Catherine's Guild, a collection of artisan studios featuring Baltic glassware, quilts, hats and other traditional crafts. Following your tour, enjoy some free time to shop for souvenirs and gifts. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

# Day 9

Wednesday, July 30, 2025

Riga, Latvia

We arrive in Riga at Noon & depart at 6:00 PM.  
Excursions begin at 1:00 PM.

Excursion: RIX-L / Riga & Folk Music | Duration: 4 hrs

Riga is the capital of Latvia, the largest city of the country and the most cosmopolitan town of the Baltic capitals. It is a well-known and highly appreciated industrial, commercial, cultural and financial center of the Baltic States as well as one of the most important seaports of the region. Experience the splendid, Old-World architecture and landmarks of Latvia during this scenic, half-day sightseeing excursion through this historic city.



Depart the pier for the brief drive past the Presidential Palace to the unique Art Nouveau area. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour of Alberta Street, home of some of the finest Art Nouveau architecture in Europe. Afterward, re-board your coach and drive past the Old Zeppelin Hangers, Boulevard Circle, Latvia University and the National Opera House.

Next, pass by the Freedom Monument en route to the Monument of the Latvian Riflemen, then take a guided walking tour through the historic center of Riga, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. While strolling through the Medieval Hanseatic Old Town, pass the red-brick Gothic building, the tallest in Old Riga, the early-13th-century St. Peter's Lutheran Church, St. John's Lutheran Church, the big and small Guilds,

Stop at a unique venue to enjoy a brief folk music concert. From here, visit Pils Square, home of the imposing, 14th-century Riga Castle. Additional sights to be seen include the Three Brothers, the oldest building in Riva, St. Jacob's Church and the remains of the city's fortified Medieval wall.

Your tour concludes back at the pier.

Klaipeda , Lithuania

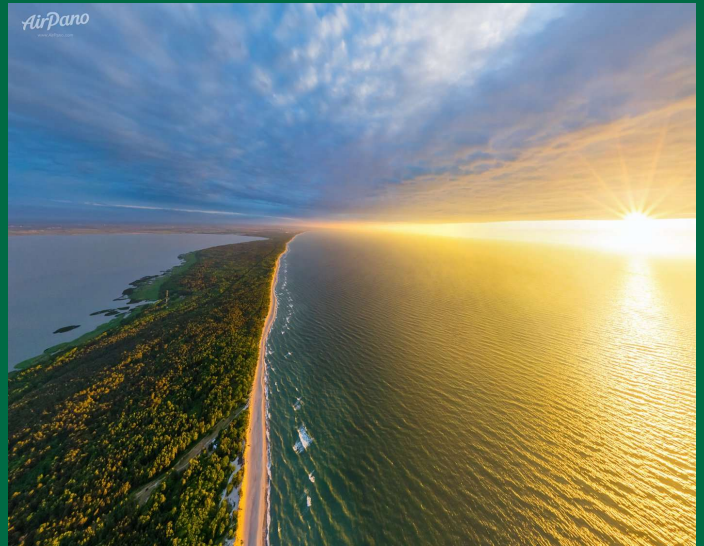

**Excursion: KLJ-H / Cycling in Klaipeda and Spit National Park | Duration: 4 hrs**

*Explore Klaipeda Old Town and a unique place in Lithuania: the Curonian Spit National park.*



During your old town cycling tour, you will see the Theatre Square with the famous sculpture of Anchen von Tharau, the Old Town with its reconstructed Yacht harbor, and the Dane River promenade.

After a short ferry ride to the Curonian Spit, cycle through the pine woods. En route you will admire beautiful sites like the harbor gate and its protection mole heading to the Baltic Sea for several kilometers, exposition of boats from ancient and soviet times, and ethnographic fisherman's household.

Be on the lookout as you may have a chance to discover a piece of golden amber washed ashore, or swim in the Baltic Sea, try local snacks and drinks and from panoramic dune and enjoy the beautiful views of the Curonian Lagoon, the Baltic Sea and changing face of Klaipeda city with its modern skyscrapers.

# Day 11

Friday, August 1, 2025

Gdańsk, Poland

We arrive in Gdańsk at 8:00 AM & depart at 7:00 PM.

Excursions begin at 9:30 AM.

**Excursion: GDN-L / Gdańsk Highlights | Duration: 3.75 hrs**

Explore the splendid, Old-World architecture and landmarks of Gdansk during this scenic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to the Old Town of Gdansk. En route, pass through the suburban and commercial sections of Gdansk, and by the Gdansk Shipyards and 'Solidarity Square'. Upon arrival in the Old Town, begin your guided walking tour.



The city's 1,000 years of history has left a collection of marvellous buildings and monuments designed in the Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles, and decorated with elaborate facades crowned by a myriad of ornate gables. Pass by the Town Hall, Long Market and beautiful, 15th-century merchants' palace of Artus Court. After a brief pause at Neptune's Fountain, stroll down to the waterfront canal before turning up Mariacka, or 'St. Mary's Street', which delights visitors with its lively atmosphere, quaint shops and lovely terraced buildings.

A visit is made to the Gothic-styled St. Mary's Church. The pride of Gdansk, St. Mary's is the world's largest brick church and accommodates some 25,000 worshippers. Situated in the center of the Old Town, this medieval church took 159 years to build, and its deceptively plain exterior belies a bright, spacious interior with large windows and more than 30 beautifully decorated chapels. The high altar displays a lovely polyptych, the floor is covered with ancient tombstones and the northern transept holds an amazing, 15th century astronomical clock, complete with the zodiac cycle and a calendar of the saints. Leaving St. Mary's Church, some free time is made available for shopping in the Old Town at your leisure before re-boarding your coach and driving back to the port.

# Day 12

Saturday, August 2, 2025

Ronne, Bornholm, Denmark

We arrive in Ronne, Bornholm at 9:00 AM & depart at 7:00 PM. Excursions begin at 2:30 PM.

Excursion: GDN-L / Highlights of Bornholm | Duration: 4 hrs

Explore the picturesque farmlands and coastlines of this tiny Baltic Island during this comprehensive half-day tour.

After a brief encounter with the capital city of Rønne, drive north through small villages to Hammershus Castle Ruin, one of the largest in Northern Europe. The setting is dramatic and well-chosen: It provides an excellent defense installation and a prominent trading post in the Baltic region. The castle was built in the early



1200's and served for close to 500 years as a fortress, prison, storage and administrative seat before being abandoned in the early 1700's.

Driving along the shore passing through villages as Sandvig Allinge and Tejn we will soon reach Gudhjem. Pay a visit to the charming little fishing village of Gudhjem. This is probably the most scenic of all Bornholm fishing villages. Meaning 'Home of God', this quaint village of only 780 permanent residents, clings to the side of a rocky bay on the North-Eastern side of the island. Fishing and whaling were the main sources of income but have since been replaced by tourism. Gudhjem was also the first place to start smoking and exporting herring, a tradition that was to become the 'signature delicacy' for the entire island. Enjoy approximately one hour of free time to explore this quaint fishing village on your own.

Then, continue to one of the round churches, special to this island and parts of Southern Sweden. These types of churches are named for their completely circular structures and were a popular type of construction in the 11th and 12th century when churches not only served as places of worship, but as defensive structures in uncertain times. Enjoy an inside visit to this fascinating old church before returning to the pier.

Christiania, also known as Freetown Christiania, is a unique and vibrant neighborhood in Copenhagen's Christianshavn district. Established in 1971 by a group of hippies, artists, and activists who occupied an abandoned military base, it has grown into an autonomous community with its own rules and regulations, independent of the Danish government. Covering 34 hectares, Christiania is known for its colorful murals, eclectic architecture, and a strong sense of community.

Visitors can explore its car-free streets, enjoy local cafes, and browse artisan shops. Key activities include visiting the Christiania Art Gallery, which showcases works by local artists, and Galopperiet, an exhibition space for contemporary art. The Gray Hall, a historic venue, hosts concerts and cultural events. For a taste of local life, stroll through the Green Light District, where you can see the famous Pusher Street, known for its open cannabis market.

Outdoor enthusiasts can enjoy the lush green spaces and scenic views along the canals. Christiania also offers guided tours that provide insights into its history, culture, and unique way of life. Despite its controversial past, Christiania remains a popular tourist attraction, offering a glimpse into an alternative lifestyle.
